# **Targeted support**

### Reframing incidents of racial harm in primary schools

Part 1 – Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November – 9.30 – 12.00 IN PERSON Part 2 – Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> November 9.30 – 12.00 IN PERSON BOTH sessions must be attended.

The way in which we understand incidents and issues of racial harm informs how these issues are responded to in schools. This two-part training offers new ways of framing these issues, which leads to new approaches in 'first aid' responses and management of issues/ incidents.

Content includes:

- understanding the range of racialized experiences that young people have and how they navigate these
- examining common school approaches (dismissive, punitive, corrective)
- exploring trauma-informed responses
- rethinking intent and impact
- working towards more restorative approaches for incident/issue management

Preferably two members of staff from each participating school, one of whom is a person of colour member of staff
