Impact of Technology Enabled Abuse on Domestic Abuse Victim-survivors

This event will look at the ways in which domestic abuse, stalking and harassment can take place online as well as in person. This can include by a perpetrator monitoring social media, the internet, accessing emails and connecting to devices in the home (when living together or after separation), with perpetrators maintaining control over a survivor's online presence and accounts. The session will explore how victim-survivors can mitigate their digital exposure through improving their online security.
