

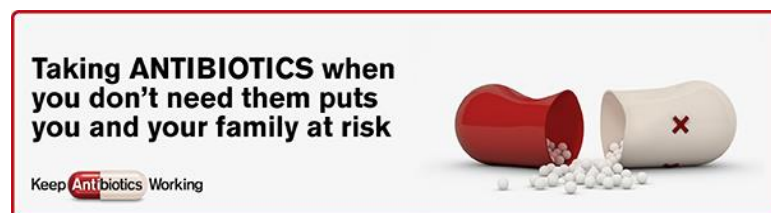

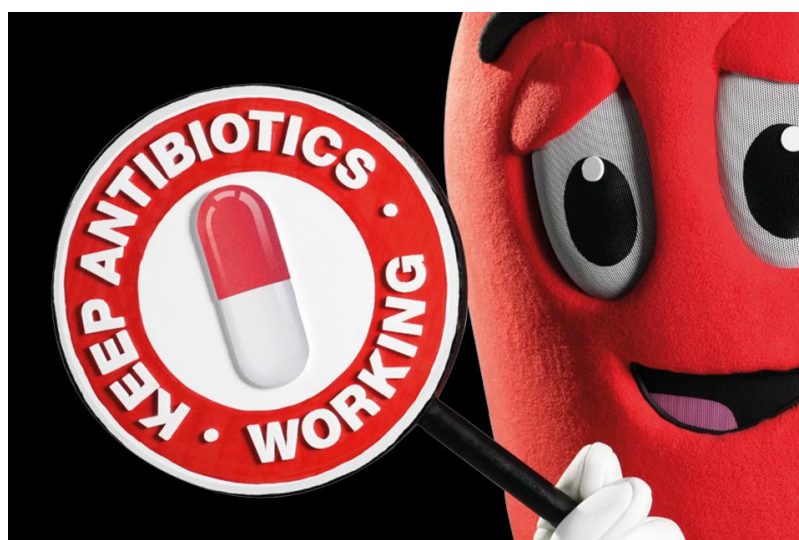

Please help us protect these life-saving medicines and support the Antibiotic Guardian campaign to Keep Antibiotics Working Globally.

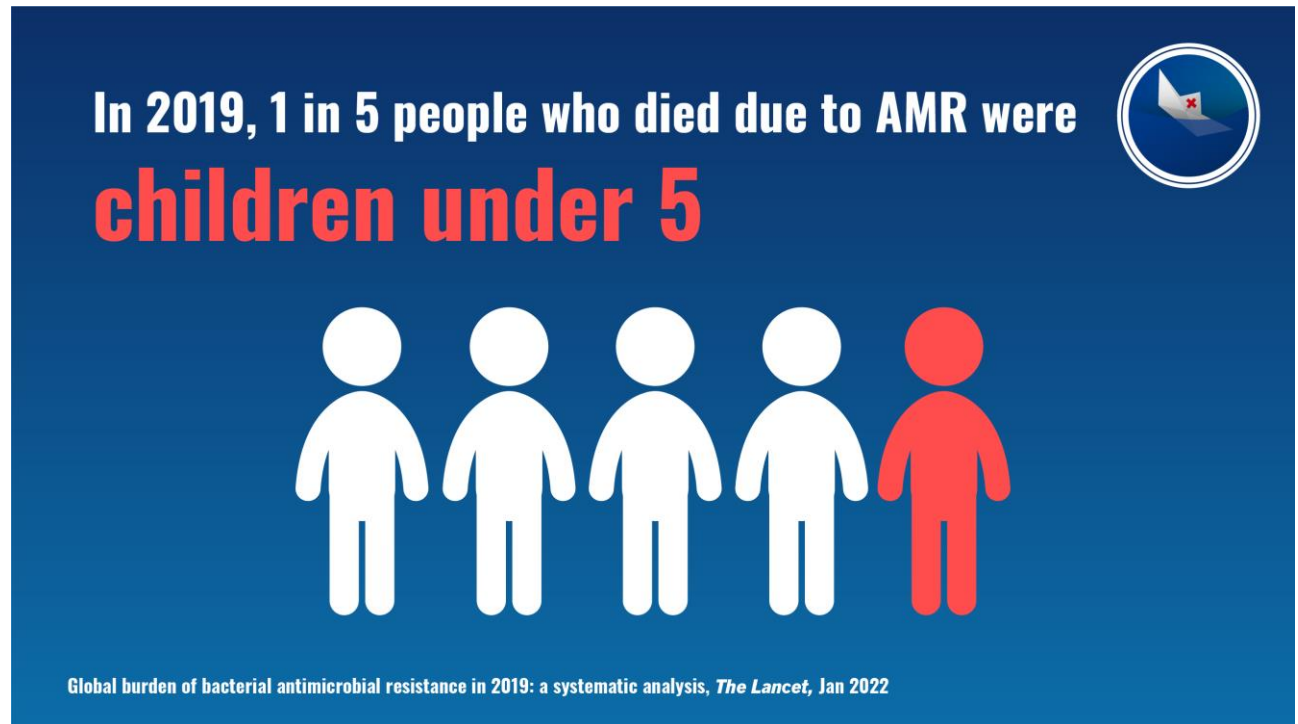
Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West Integrated Care Board would like to invite your school to participate in a competition to raise awareness of drug-resistant infections and how to take action to use antibiotics responsibly and prevent the spread of infections.



Can you join **#AndiBiotic** on his antimicrobial resistance (AMR) mission to **#KeepAntibioticsWorking**? The [Antibiotic Guardian](#) campaign asks you to make a pledge to [#keepantibioticsworking](#).



In 2019, 1.27 million deaths were attributed to AMR or drug-resistant infections. This figure is predicted to reach more than 39 million by 2050 if we don't act now!



Who can take part in the competition?

Anyone between the age of 5-18 years of age.

Categories

School years 1-4: Design a poster using [AndiBiotic](#) as your character.

School years 5-13: Create a “Horrible Histories” story to explain how drug-resistant infections can occur, how they might spread and what can happen as a result.

NB two age categories for prizes - junior category (Years 5-8) and senior category (Years 9-13)

The aim of this competition is to explain how drug-resistant infections can occur, how they might spread and what can happen as a result. Posters / stories should deliver messages to use antibiotics responsibly and #keepantibioticsworking.

How do I send in my entry?

- Design your poster or create your Horrible Histories story

- Make sure your name, age and school are clearly written on your entry.
- **Deadline for submission for the competition is Friday 24th October 2025.**

Why participate?

- Each winning participant will have their poster displayed in hospitals / waiting areas and may be used for future campaigns. The Horrible Histories story will be used in the coming year to raise awareness within our communities of this issue.
- There will be winners selected for each category (£25 Amazon voucher):
 - **Best Poster Years 1-2**
 - **Best Poster Years 3-4**
 - **Best Horrible History story Years 5-8**
 - **Best Horrible History story Years 9-13**

What should be included?

The entry of the poster can be designed using whatever media the child wishes.

It should incorporate some or all the key messages:

- Don't take antibiotics for colds and flu
- Don't save antibiotics for later – never share or use leftover antibiotics
- Take antibiotics as directed by your healthcare professional.
- Take up vaccinations for yourselves and your pets to prevent infection
- Get regular dental check-ups and brush your teeth regularly to prevent infections
- Never demand antibiotics if your health professional says you don't need them.
- Not sharing antibiotics with animals

Hints and tips:

- Keep it simple.
- Make it eye catching.
- Make sure that the messages are clear and concise.

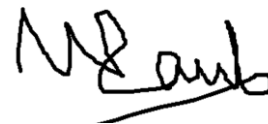

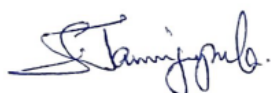
